


### Maths

### **History**

We will be completing the 'Ancient Greece' topic before moving onto a local history study of Portishead.

Study of the Easter Vigil will enable children to develop a detailed understanding of the symbolism of Easter, as well as the beliefs that lie behind it. The story of Lazarus helps explore reaction to and the effect of the resurrection. Symbolism of the resurrection is explored.
