#### **Uniform**

Many members of the public comment on how smart our children look and I want to thank all parents that keep their children looking so smart.

However there are a couple of things that are creeping into school that are not part of our uniform. Open neck shirts that are not compatible with ties, blouses rather than school shirts and no tie at all. If your child has lost their tie please buy a new one and like all uniform it should be named. We haven't got any more spare ties in the office as children have taken them home (and lost them again). Children should be wearing black or navy coats and black or navy school shoes. Boots are not part of the uniform. However, if it is very wet or snowy than your child can come to school wearing boots and change into shoes.

## **Punctuality**

The morning school bell is at 8.20am and children should be on the school premises ready to enter their classrooms and start registration straightaway. Children who are late and are entering through the school office can disturb classes who are already settled and working. Please allow a little extra time for your morning routine if needed to ensure children are punctual.

#### **Car Parking**

A gentle reminder about car park courtesy... In order to aid the flow of traffic please do not double park or block any of the spaces. Please only use the Bus Stop area to allow children to disembark directly onto the footpath, and then exit the car park as soon as possible. If you need to leave your vehicle to escort your child into the playground or the building please ensure you are parking in an appropriate bay or park off site.
