## **Parent/ Carer Acceptable Use Policy Agreement**

New technologies have become integral to the lives of children and young people in today's society, both within schools and in their lives outside school. The internet and other digital information and communications technologies are powerful tools, which open up new opportunities for everyone. These technologies can stimulate discussion, promote creativity and stimulate awareness of context to promote effective learning. Young people should have an entitlement to safe internet access at all times.

This Acceptable Use Policy is intended to ensure:

- That young people will be responsible users and stay safe while using the internet and other communications technologies for educational, personal and recreational use.
- That school ICT systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and users at risk.
- That parents and carers are aware of the importance of e-safety and are involved in the education and guidance of young people with regard to their on-line behaviour.

The school will try to ensure that *pupils* will have good access to ICT to enhance their learning and will, in return, expect the *pupils* to agree to be responsible users. Pupils will receive e safety education to help them understand the importance of safe use of the internet.

The school will take every reasonable precaution, including monitoring and filtering systems, to ensure that young people will be safe when they use the internet and ICT systems.

The school cannot ultimately be held responsible for the nature and content of materials accessed on the internet and using mobile technologies which has not been set by the teacher.

The pupil's activities on the ICT systems will be monitored and that the school will contact the parent or carer if they have concerns about any possible breaches of the Acceptable Use Policy.

Pupils will be encouraged to adopt safe use of the internet and digital technologies at home and will inform the school if I have concerns over my child's e-safety.

The school will comply with the Data Protection Act. We will also ensure that when images are published that the young people cannot be identified by the use of their full names.

A copy of the Pupil Acceptable Use Policy is attached so that parents / carers will be aware of the school expectations of the young people in their care.

<b>I know that if I break the rules I might not be allowed to use a computer.</b>	

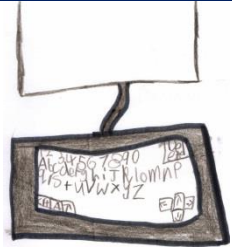


## Key Stage 1 Acceptable User Policy

I will click on Hector or tell an adult if there is something I don't like.



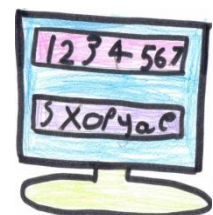




