Meet the teacher/Home work/Covid lesson packs

- PowerPoint presentations are available for each class meet the teacher on your child's Google classroom page.
- Weekly homework and a termly class project will also be set for your child on Google classroom.
- If your child has to self-isolate or is off school awaiting COVID test results there will be COVID packs available on your child's classroom page. These packs will be updated by the teacher to reflect the core subjects (English and Maths) that are being taught in class. We would ask you to refer to the termly curriculum overviews for the rest of the subjects and use BBC bitesize or Oak academy to supplement your child's learning. Should a whole class need to self- isolate we would go back to the model we had during the initial stage of lock down with the teacher setting daily work and your child returning it for comment.

If you need to speak to your child's class teacher please email the school and it will be forwarded to the relevant teacher to make arrangements. At present we are not having face to face meetings so they will take place by telephone or Teams.

Please contact Mr Bath via the school office if you are unable to access Google Classroom. It is imperative for all families to have access to the Google platform in the event a class or school lockdown is necessary.

Parent's evenings:

These meetings are, as in the past, for settling in and initial progress during term 1: Reception-Year 6.

They will take place on Monday 19^{th,} Tuesday 20th, Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22nd of October; these will be held by telephone and you will be given an hour slot for a 10 minute phone chat. We will send out this information in your child's school diary week beginning 5th of October. You will be able to email the school office if the time is unsuitable.



Nut allergy

We would like to remind everyone that we are a **nut free school**, please do not send your child to school with nuts either for a snack or in their lunch box. We have several children who are severely allergic to nuts.

Reading at home

We are relaunching our reading aloud 5x per week at home for 10 minutes. This is especially beneficial for your child's reading development at every age. We are pleased to announce that Year 6 came top this week – well done Year 6! There will be a reward at the end of every term for the class with the most reading aloud numbers. Please sign your child's school diary if they have read to you for 10 minutes at home.

School Uniform Reminder:

Summer uniform can be worn up to Friday 2nd October. If you are unsure of the uniform code there is a list available in the office and on the web site. Please make sure everything is named as it will go into the lost property box if it is left unnamed around the school.

PE kits can be worn into school when it is your child's PE day, your class teacher will let you know when these days are.

Starting school September 2021

If you have a child born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017, then now is the time to apply for a place at our school for admission from September 2021 onwards. You must complete an application form that is available from the school admissions team of North Somerset Council. <u>www.n-somerset.gov.uk/admissions</u>

If your child has been baptised and you wish to apply for our school, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15 January 2021."



The closing date for reception applications is 23:59 on 15 January 2020. There are open afternoons when you can visit the school at 3pm on 24th September, 22nd October and the 19th of November, please contact the school office if you wish to attend. These will be socially distanced open afternoons and will take place after the children have gone home. We are asking for parents only to attend these afternoons.

School Milk

Children can have free school milk up until their 5th birthday if you would like your child to have milk after this please telephone the school milk service **on 01934510950.** They will arrange for you to pay them directly and they will send us an updated list every week.

Free School Meals

If your circumstances have changed or you are a new Reception parent on a low income you may be entitled to free school meals you can apply on line or come into the school office and we can help.
