COVID NEWS

Please don't forget the rules following a positive PCR test in your household, the whole family need to self-isolate for 10 days. It is recommended that you get the whole family tested, if the rest of the results come back negative you will still need to self-isolate. If a pupil at St Joseph's tests positive please inform the school as soon as possible so we can take the necessary steps to stop the spread of infection (this includes the week end as the school e mail will be monitored).

All teaching staff at St Joseph's are now taking lateral flow tests twice weekly. Primary school children do not need to take these tests in school; however the Government recommends that you order these tests for your household to use at home.
