At St Joseph's there will be a music focus on instruments for many over the summerterms with Year 3 learning violin and Year 4 learning pocket trumpet with Mrs Page while Year 5 will be having clarinet lessons with Miss Laken in partnership with Miss Clough from North Somerset Music Service. Mr Bath will be running a lunchtime ukulele club and Mrs Page a lunchtime recorder club as well as the usual after school band practices.

There is no charge for any of these activities. Historically our school band has had a good number of children playing orchestral instruments including woodwind, brass and strings, but numbers of children taking up these instruments is currently very low.

In order to encourage children to consider taking these instruments further, in early June there will be an opportunity for any children who would like to continue learning an instrument in the Autumn to sign up for group or individual lessons at the usual rates with teachers from the Music Service (Group lessons approx. £7. Individual lessons approx. £11).

The school has 2 flutes, 2 clarinets, 2 saxophones, a cornet and several violins which would be available for loan thus allowing children to learn without the necessity to buy or hire an instrument and so keeping down the cost of learning.
