## Start and end to the school day

The rain this week has caused havoc in the car park and what I can only describe as a very near miss with regards a child and a car. **PLEASE try and park off site if the car park is full**. Years 3 and 4 parents do not need to arrive until just before 3pm (2.45pm on Friday) to collect their children; by that time there will be some spaces as R, 1 and 2 parents will have left. We will be asking parents of YRS 3 and 4 to leave the car park if they arrive too early.

### **Coronavirus news**

The Government have issued the latest guidelines for remote learning, should schools have to close or children are self-isolating, this is on the website under parents/COVID information. There are so many countries on the 2 week quarantine list and Poland has just been added. If you do go to one of these countries you must all self-isolate for 2 weeks which means your child will be out of school for another 2 weeks.

## School Uniform/ warm layers Reminder:

Summer uniform can be worn up to Friday 2nd October. If you are unsure of the uniform code there is a list available in the office and on the web site. Please make sure everything is named as it will go into the lost property box if it is left unnamed around the school. **Please** remember that your child needs a coat as the weather is getting cooler, a waterproof coat is essential if it is raining as we still like to get the children outside even if it's drizzling.

PE kits can be worn into school when it is your child's PE day, your class teacher will let you know when these days are. We are trying to keep the school as airy as possible to that end it is quite cold in school. Your child could wear some extra layers under their uniform to keep them warm. We are allowing them to wear coats in class so an extra warm coat would be also useful.

# Rapid support for children and young people affected by the coronavirus crisis (Barnardos/DfE)

Barnardos has launched a new scheme to help young people affected by the coronavirus crisis. The See, Hear, Respond Partnership will quickly identify and support children, young people and families who are struggling to cope with the impacts of coronavirus. Its aim is to provide early intervention before these children reach the threshold for statutory intervention.

See, Hear, Respond does not replace your usual referral process for children who meet a statutory threshold for significant harm: such referrals must be made to your local authoritysafeguarding team using your usual safeguarding procedures.

Barnardos say they 'especially want to invite referrals for families who are most isolated from support due to Covid-19, including:

- Under 5s with a specific focus on under 2s
- Those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities and where there are concerns about their welfare e.g. online safety
- Children and young people experiencing anxiety, stress and other mental health difficulties
- Children who may be at increased risk of abuse, neglect and exploitation inside or outside of the home
- Black, Asian, Minority Ethnic and Refugee children who experience barriers to accessing services

## **Starting school September 2021**

If you have a child born between 1 September 2016 and 31 August 2017, then now is the time to apply for a place at our school for admission from September 2021 onwards. You must complete an application form that is available from the school admissions team of North Somerset Council. <u>www.n-somerset.gov.uk/admissions</u>

If your child has been baptised and you wish to apply for our school, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15 January 2021."

The closing date for reception applications is 23:59 on 15 January 2020. There are open afternoons when you can visit the school at 3pm on 24<sup>th</sup> September, 22<sup>nd</sup> October and the 19<sup>th</sup> of November, please contact the school office if you wish to attend. These will be socially distanced open afternoons and will take place after the children have gone home. We are asking for parents only to attend these afternoons.



## Free School Meals

If your circumstances have changed or you are a new Reception parent on a low income you may be entitled to free school meals you can apply on line or come into the school office and we can help.
