Unfortunately the Fortnite saga rumbles on. In school we have had reports of children logging on at very odd times during the night. Young children (6, 7 and 8 years old), talking about communicating with their boyfriends who live in London! Children using the group to Cyber Bully other children. The gaming industry has a PEGI rating of 12 that means it is not suitable for children under that age. I realise that many of our children are playing the game but I would urge you to PLEASE limit the time your child plays -be vigilant with whom they are communicating with- watch what they are doing. Reading with your child

Research tells us that reading every evening with your child makes a huge difference to their reading progress particularly in Reception and KS1. What we do in school is important but we cannot do it alone. I have noticed that in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 there are quite a few children that have not had signatures in their reading record books for some time. I know we are all really busy but please make time to read with your child at least 3x per week, 10 minutes makes all the difference.
