Scams during the COVID-19 pandemic

ActionFraud reported a 400% increase in reports of coronavirus related fraud in March 2020. These cyber attacks are using Covid-19 to lure people in to clicking links or opening attachments.

At a time when many of us are working in different ways, it is essential to employ your usual approach to emails, and not rush into clicking or replying – these attacks are designed to trick you.

Some of the most recent scams to be aware of are:

Support for free school meals

Parents receiving an email stating 'As schools will be closing, if you're entitled to free school meals, please send your bank details and we'll make sure you're supported'. Parents are being urged to not respond and to delete this email.

Phishing emails with malicious attachments

COVID-19 phishing emails that have malicious Word documents or other attachments containing embedded computer viruses. For example, one email pretends to originate from the World Health Organisation and invites the recipient to open an attachment for advice on safety measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 Another phishing email pretends to be international health sector organisation. The email invites the recipient to click on the link to access information about new cases of the COVID-19 virus in their local area. *Source: Australian Cyber-Security Centre*

SMS Phishing

It has been reported that fake COVID-19 websites are being registered, with text messages appearing to be from the Government then being sent to the public, urging them to click on the link. The websites have been found to contain Trojan software that is designed to steal people's financial information.

Fake NHS donations email

ActionFraud have received 41 reports of a scam email purporting to be from HM Government, asking for donations to the NHS during the COVID-19 outbreak.

Tips on spotting phishing emails

- Poor grammar, punctuation and spelling.
- Addressed to 'valued customer', 'friend', or 'colleague'.
- A veiled threat that asks you to act urgently.
- Does the sender's name sound legitimate, or is it trying to mimic someone you know?
- Does it sounds too good to be true?
- Asking for personal information from an email.

For official information about coronavirus, please refer to trusted resources such as the Public Health England or NHS websites.

What should you do?

If you think an email is suspicious, follow these steps:

- Don't open any attachments or click on any links
 - \circ $\;$ Beware The address may look genuine, but have some slight differences
