Nits have made a return to school. An email was sent out earlier. Please check your child's hair regularly and treat if you find any visitors! Your local pharmacist will be able to advice on effective treatments.

Socks (When wearing shorts or trousers)

Please can you make sure your child wears the correct socks if they are wearing shorts.

They should be charcoal grey and ankle or knee length. Trainer socks are not part of our uniform code.

Summer Dresses

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 can wear summer uniform after Easter.

Dresses should be gold (yellow) and white striped – not check please.

KS2 children are no longer asked to wear summer uniform as they can wear skirts or shorts with short sleeved shirts to stay cool.

Ties - Elastic

If your child wears a tie with elastic, it should be tight enough to look like a proper tie. If the elastic is loose, please replace the elastic or the tie! As the children do not need to change for PE in school, you can choose to buy a 'proper' tie – especially if your child is in Year 2 or above.


