Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a busier week than usual as we welcomed back the Year 6 children, it has been great to see them and they all looked very pleased to be back! It was also great to see you all this morning for the Team's assembly. I hope to be able to extend that to other Year groups soon.

### The latest Government advice states,

'Primary pupils can be invited back into school for a face-to-face meeting before the summer holidays, provided schools follow protective measures guidance'.

We are therefore planning for the last week of term (W/B 13<sup>th</sup> July) to bring all our children back to school so that they can be with their own teacher for 2 days of that week. We will run it along the same guidelines as the current Year 6 attendance, with children split into 2 groups of 15. One group will attend on Monday and Tuesday and one group Wednesday and Thursday with a deep clean in between. It will mean that the current R and Year 1 will have to go part time for that week.

We hope we will not have to run a key worker group that week, but we understand there might be some parents who cannot manage on a part time basis and would wish their children to still be in a full time key worker group for that week.

I will be in touch at the end of next week with more details, as drop off times and pick up times will also need to be staggered.

We also hope to welcome the new reception children for a stay and play on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July, there will be a morning and afternoon group, more details to follow.

It is still a very personal decision as to whether or not you would like your child to attend school, but I know the teachers are very excited about the prospects of being with their own class again.

#### Updated handwashing advice

It is essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Handwashing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them

into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus. Hand sanitiser can be effective

if soap is not available or the situation makes using soap less feasible (i.e. when outside) but using hand sanitiser

provides none of the virus-destroying friction that rubbing your hands together and rinsing with water provides.
