Dear Parents and Carers,

Well so much can happen in a week as we know from recent experience! I still want to reassure you that we are working hard with all the staff and Governors to make sure that we get this right for you and your children. I just wanted to highlight a few points from recent Government publications.

What we know so far:

- Sadly, we will not be returning to 'normal' in the near future.
- Schools may reopen from 1st June to Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 pupils if the government thinks it is safe then to do so. We must stress this is still a provisional date and the guidance says to consider increasing the number of pupils in school from June onwards, *not specifically on June 1st*. The proposal to begin the recovery of schools from June onwards is still contingent upon the public health criteria being met.
- Schools in England currently remain closed for most pupils except for the children of critical workers and vulnerable children.
- The current guidance is that teaching groups must remain separated from each other and the critical worker group to reduce the probability of cross-contamination.
- In order to keep classes to the stated maximum number of 15 pupils it is possible that children may not be able to attend a full week and will return on a part time basis and/ or that we operate a phased return. It also potentially means that pupils may return and not be with their normal Class teacher or all their usual classmates.
- We will continue planning home learning activities for pupils in year groups not returning to school, but this may be on a reduced scale if the teaching staff are likely to be involved in school-based teaching.

We don't know yet:

- > When the government will confirm the date for the phased reopening of schools.
- ➢ How we will operate in terms of the school day and classroom allocation to maintain safety recommendations.

- The exact health and safety measures that will be put in place.
- > Whether we have enough staff able to provide the cover for the numbers of children returning.

We have already sent a letter out to Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 parents with a link to a Google Poll, it is really important that parents return the poll as soon as possible so we can continue with our planning.

I continue to find strength in prayer that God will help us through these difficult times and decisions.

Many of you will have seen the wonderful **virtual choirs** that have been formed and produced some really uplifting music. We've decided this would be a great project for our parishes and would love you to take part. You can either play an instrument or sing and don't have to be particularly musically gifted.
