Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Term 4!

As we are half-way through the school year, it is sometimes a good opportunity to revisit things that may have been shared previously or even assumed to be known by parents.

School News & Updates

World Book Day – Thursday 7th March

This year we are asking children to come to school on World Book Day in their pyjamas and onesies to celebrate enjoying a bedtime read. We are asking the children to bring in their favourite bedtime book – perhaps one they are enjoying reading at home or an old favourite.

There is no need to visit Amazon (or other online stores) and pay for a costume your child will wear once!

World Book Day – Poster Competition

The PTFA are supporting the school with a prize for each year group for the best poster advertising a good read. Choose your bedtime favourite or an adventure story, wizards and dragons – it is up to you. But make someone want to pick up the book and read it themselves. Entries need to be brought into school by 7th March – winners will be announced in assembly on Friday 8th March.

Pupil Absence

The government has made it clear that school attendance is paramount for children to make progress in school.

The local authority is now being more proactive in supporting schools and I will be having regular meetings with our Education Welfare Officer (EWO) and North Somerset.

As a school, we have a legal responsibility to record attendance accurately. We therefore have to trust parents to keep us up-to-date with appointments and illness but also to inform us accurately of any absence.

We have had a number of cases recently where parents have taken their child out of school citing "illness" when it is clear that the child is on holiday with parents – it does not help maintain a good relationship with parents and also relies on the child to keep a secret. Most children cannot! If the school feels there is evidence that a holiday has taken place, the days will be recorded as unauthorised and, in some cases, a fine issued.

If you have no option but to take a holiday in term time, please fill out a absence request form. Fixed penalty fines are issued for ten sessions (five full days) in a six-month period.

Parents' Evenings

Please contact school if you did not manage to see your child's teacher before half term. We can arrange for a telephone call or a meeting at a different time.

Year 6 SATs Meeting

A number of parents in Year 6 asked for more information about the annual "Quiz Week" in Year 6. There will be an online meeting with opportunities for questions on Thursday 22nd February at 4pm. Please log into your child's google account and use their Google classroom link.

Smart Watches and Gadgets

Children should not have any electronic devices in school. This includes smart watches and "FitBit" style devices. We would encourage children to wear a normal watch if they have one.

Mobile Phones

If your child is walking home from school and is in Year 5 or Year 6 then them having a mobile phone is a great way to give them and you a way to keep in touch and stay safe. Phones must be handed into the class teacher and not used on the school premises. If your child is not walking home

Toys in School

We appreciate that some of the youngest children need a toy or cuddly in the mornings but children in Year 1 to Year 6 should not be bringing any toys into school.

Dropping Off

Please use the drop-off facility in the morning for Key Stage 2 children to help with parking.

Whilst some parents prefer to stay and chat, if your child is in Year1 or Year 2 and are happy, you can leave them on the playground in the morning. Both gates are supervised and Mr Broyd, Mr Sturdy or I will cover the playground.

The programme is principally a digestion source focused on images and videos, with a private chat function which for many is the sole reason for its use. In today's image focused society, it can be an outlet for how people wish to be perceived physically or in regards to their personality. As a result it actively encourages people to post about their personal life, in a way that would be detrimental should everyone have access to it.
