## School News & Updates

### After-School Club (ASC)

Term 1 fees are now on ParentPay and need settling by 29th September (2 weeks' time), these will include the £25 annual registration fee. This is all in line with our T&Cs.

### Parking – Again!

We are trialling a **different approach** to managing the car park at the beginning and end of the day.

The main gates will not be closed at the end of the day to allow a flow of traffic and we have reduced the staff parking by three places.

While there is a majority of parents who use the car park safely, there are some who need reminding – so please bear these things in mind:

- Only park in marked bays – please do not park on double yellow lines or double park.
- If you have a blue disabled badge, you are welcome to use one of the two spaces on the main car park and one outside Year5 and Year 6. We do have a number of families and grandparents who are entitled to use these spaces.
- Do not park in staff spaces at any time. There was a couple of days last week when a member of staff could not get into the car park as there were no spaces available.

Please do not take offence if the caretaker or another member of staff asks you to move on or vacate a staff space. It is only fair if all car park users follow the same rules.

Please also remember the **5mph speed limit** at all times. There are some parents who seem to forget when they are in a hurry.

And a final **reminder** that there is a **one-way** system in place.
