History and Geography

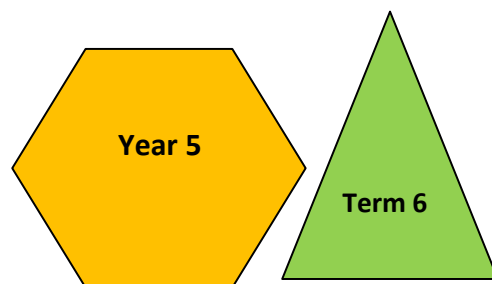
A local study of Portishead - we will look at the changes that have taken place over time using evidence from maps, photographs and public records.
