Dear Parents and Carers,

We are now in the last week of term and children and staff are looking forward to a restful holiday.

Thank you for your support during Term 4 especially during weeks with staff changes due to COVID.

We remain cautious but positive about the return to normality in school.

Please remember that school breaks up at <u>1pm</u> on Friday 8th April. If your child attends ASC then the session will run from 1pm to 3pm.

COVID Update

The guidance for schools has now been removed following two years of ever-changing advice. We are now being encouraged by the government to "live with the virus" as it becomes endemic rather than a pandemic.

The government guidance now states:

"Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

"Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.

"All children and young people with respiratory symptoms should be encouraged to cover their mouth and nose with a disposable tissue when coughing and/or sneezing and to wash their hands after using or disposing of tissues."

<u>Please do not send your child into school if</u> <u>they not well enough or have a temperature or</u> <u>fever.</u>

The advice for testing children is as follows:

"It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.

"If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can. After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

"Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal."
