Many people have reported improved quality of viewing as a result. We are thinking about offering streaming via app on Roku, Apple TV and Amazon Fire TV. Following a suggestion made at the Portishead Pastoral Team meeting, we are offering an hour's virtual adoration every Thursday from 9 to 10pm, beginning **this evening**. This will be at josephfrancis.org/livestream and across our social media channels.

We just wanted to reassure all parents of current Year 6 students who are due to join us at Gordano in September that we are continuing to work very hard to ensure that their transition to Gordano is as smooth and reassuring as possible. However, in the present circumstances, we have had to change the way we are supporting our new children and their parents and carers. Please note the following changes to the published programme:

- The information evening for new parents on 5th May has been cancelled

- We are looking at the possibility of running some parental information evenings in July, provided that we can do so in line with guidance from Public Health England
