Lost Children – Finding Them Fast

During the summer in particular, children regularly become separated from parents on days out in the excitement of a new place or adventure. This can result in numerous agencies being involved in searching for them – police, street wardens, beach rangers, security staff, etc and obviously the longer a child is lost the greater the risks for them. We want to make this process more efficient and as parents and carers you are in the best position to help us do this.

Talk to your children and remember these three simple steps for any day out or crowded area:

- 1. <u>Take a number</u>: Ensure the children in your care have your contact telephone number, e.g. on a wristband, on a temporary transfer on their wrist, on a piece of paper, on their mobile if they have one. This will enable them to ask a professional to call you if you become separated (e.g. police, security staff, shop staff, etc.).
- 2. <u>Take a moment</u>: Agree a safe place to meet in the event that you do become separated. The lost children safe place in Weston-Super-Mare town centre is at the Tourist Information Centre on the seafront so if you're planning a trip to the beach then this is a good point.
- 3. <u>Take a photo</u>: Take a full length photo when you arrive at your destination of the children in your care, so that if you do become separated you can provide a clear and accurate description of them.

We have been trialling a new system with regards the green gates at the side of the school. After listening to parents views and consulting with staff and Governors it has been decided to keep the gates open as long as there are no children in the hall with the doors open. Unfortunately this might mean that we can't give parents notice if the above is happening and they might arrive to find the gates locked until just before 3pm. This will probably be only on a few occasions and certainly not likely to happen very often in the winter.
