I have also mentioned before our new way of testing spelling. Research has shown that rote learning 10 spellings and getting 10 out of 10 each week does not make your child a better speller. Learning the way a group of words is constructed and spelling rules for groups of words is a much better way of learning. Our children are asked to find words that belong in a particular group and with the help of their teacher understand the rules. They are then tested on the spelling rule rather than regurgitating a list, this helps them memorize the rule for using in their day to day work.
